Development Education and Global Learning focuses on learning about the ways in which people's lives around the world are linked.

It is also based on an understanding of the importance of critical thinking and the need to challenge stereotypes. Its goal is to enable people to develop the skills and confidence to support change towards a more just and sustainable world

Who is the course for?

Teachers and other educators who are interested in putting into practice learning about global and development issues.

People who manage and deliver development education and global learning or related programmes, particularly within NGOs, professional bodies and government departments.

Professionals in all sectors of education and learning who wish to apply development education principles and global learning practices within their work environment.

Course Structure

You will take two required modules on development

education and global learning, and write a dissertation or a shorter report on the subject. You will also take two optional modules, which can include modules from other Masters' courses at the Institute of Education.

Entry Requirements

You should have a good honours degree or an equivalent qualification, and an interest in global and development issues within education and society in general. Some experience of working in development education, global learning or a related field is desirable.
